Angels

Angels are supernatural beings that exist in almost every culture, mythology and religion. They are depicted as benevolent celestial beings, who act as intermediaries between Heaven and humanity. Prophets

A prophet is an individual who is regarded as being in contact with a Divine being and is said to speak on that entity's behalf. The message that the prophet conveys is called a prophecy. A prophecy is a message that is claimed by a prophet to have been communicated to them by God. Such messages typically involve inspiration, interpretation, or revelation of divine will concerning events to come. All known ancient cultures had prophets who delivered prophecies. By and large, prophets were highly regarded and respected. They were not questioned and people who received the messages took them very seriously.

The Catholic Encyclopedia defines prophecy as foreknowledge of future events, though it may sometimes apply to past events of which there is no memory. The purpose of the message is to present hidden things, which cannot be known by the person.

Judaism suggests that prophecy is, in truth and reality, an emanation sent forth by a Divine Being through the medium of an individual. The Hebrew term for prophet is Navi, which literally means "spokesperson for God to the people and the people to God".

In Islam, the theory is that prophets are law-bringers, delivering God's message to the people in a language they can understand. Much of the activity of the Old Testament prophets involved conditional warnings rather than identifying the future.

In the Native American Indian system, the Elder acted as the prophet for the accumulated wisdom of their tradition. Many religions were founded based on the historical fact that one person received a prophecy from God and told that they were to start a new religion, which indeed they did.

Saints

Saints are men and women whose lives of dedication to God lifted them above the mortal realm into the Kingdom of Heaven. In 993, the Pope was asked to formally approve each saint, and the process of canonization was instituted. Official saints are ones who are canonized because they have lived holy lives and now, after death, share a beatific experience with God. Because of this relationship with God, a saint may intercede on our behalf with miraculous results. Today the Catholic church list 4,500 saints.
