

# Sacred Tribes

## **The Aborigines**

The Aborigines have a close affinity with the Dreamtime and its connection to the Creator. They believe that the Dreamtime ancestors exist in all things and speak to the ones who listen. It is their belief that we must honor all sacred dimensions and become one with their driving force. Spirituality is at their core identity, and they believe that all objects are living and share the same soul as them. They associated much of the information and wisdom they received from the planet Pleiades. The Aborigines are known to be the oldest living humans and originally migrated out of Africa.

## **The Atlanteans and Lemurians**

Atlantis and Lemuria were unique and considered star-seeded civilizations. They were very advanced, Atlantis in technology and Lemuria in spirituality. Many people today have memories or dreams about those incarnations. They were both intergalactic communities living far beyond our comprehension that exists today. Atlanteans were about the mind, Lemurians were about the spirit, and today, we are about the body. Our goal is to bring in a new future that will embody all three: mindfulness, spirituality, and a body, that can manifest a balanced, healthy existence for ourselves and the world at large.

## **The Aztecs**

The Aztecs were a Mesoamerican culture that flourished in central Mexico in the post-classic period from 1300-1521. They built one of the world's most advanced societies and were known for their warriorship, commitment, and fierceness. The Aztecs were mainly vegetarian. Drinking alcohol was only permitted on religious occasions and the amount was restricted and enforced. Today, there are approximately One and a half million descendants of the Aztecs, known as the Nahua. They live in small communities spread out across rural Mexico.

## **The Berbers of the Sahara**

For thousands of years, the Berbers of the Sahara used the stars to navigate the great trans-Saharan trade routes. The camel is the most sacred animal to them because it made trade routes accessible. They have been known to create jewelry and textiles, containing star patterns that symbolize healing and protection from the dark forces of the universe. They also have been known to utilize the evil eye symbol that can indeed deflect evil in all four directions. Though nearly all Berbers are Sunni Muslim, their traditional practices and beliefs can still be found woven into the fabric of everyday life.

## **The Celts**

The Celts focus on discovering the path for inner transformation, enlivening our psyches. Through this development, true magic is the spark created by linking the natural and supernatural worlds. Glastonbury is a place to access star energies for this transformation and this configuration is called “Merlin’s Secret”. According to the Celts, spirits are part human, part angel, and do indeed exist and should be respected and listened to. They also honor the forces of nature, see the world as inhabited by many spirits, and view the Divine as manifesting in all aspects of the natural world.

## **The Dogon**

The Dogon of Mali have a sophisticated knowledge of Sirius A, B, and C. This system has baffled scientists, since Sirius B and C cannot be seen. The Dogon have no modern technology to track the movement of these stars. For the Dogon, however, it is quite simple, as they have stated that they were taught by visitors from Sirius. They believe that transformation is not only important, but at this point in time, essential. Social harmony is extremely vital to their tribe. Their mission is to gain wisdom and activate the cosmic heart, needed knowledge for future generations.

## **The Hawaiian Culture**

The Hawaiians believe that the animals come from another higher and brighter world. And humans can contact this world by growing into their higher self, called their Aumakua. Animals, to the Hawaiians, are seen as part of a greater oracle, a revelation of light, existing on a higher level than us. The Hawaiian people work with the wisdom of the animal kingdom in order to live in harmony. Originally there was little need for oracles because observation of the animals was believed to be enough. But over time, because of certain wrong systems, such as animal sacrifice, there is now a greater need to look for what we can no longer see.

## **The Hopi**

The Hopi believe that we came from the stars and the stars are where we will return to. The Hopi Kachinas are the guides to the invisible world. They are here to keep our hearts open enough so that our evolution to the higher worlds is possible. For them, blue is the color of protection and direction. The Blue Star Kachina signals the move from one dimension to another. It is a spirit that signifies the coming of the new world. Their ceremonies are to dramatize the universal laws of life, which must be respected and adhered to. They utilize stones, dances, prayers, and ancient wisdom as a way to communicate with God.

## **The Inca**

The Inca worshipped the sun, which symbolizes gold. They believe that the stars are the sun and moon's children and that these children connect everything to Pachamama, the Earth. City planners incorporated what they learned from observing heaven and calculating its movement. This is clear from studying their royal architecture of temples, palaces, and sacred shrines. The Inca teachings are very focused on the "doorway of infinity", whereby one can cross to the upper worlds. They believe the Gods are kept happy through devoted worship. The Inca were brilliant and there are many things they created that we use today.

## **The Khoisan Tribe**

This tribe is believed to be the world's most ancient race. They have been living in southern Africa for over 30,000 years. However, over the years, their populations went into a sharp decline. They had and have incredible knowledge about animal behavior, as well as herbs that help them when they have ailments. Based on this knowledge alone, they have pristine hearing and vision. They see things with their naked eye, and today we would not even notice and hear things that we would not even be awakened to. They believe in a supreme being who presides over daily life and controls the element of our world and environment.

## **The Māori Tribe**

The Māori are the indigenous people of New Zealand, and they go back for more than 1000 years. They believe in gods, which are represented by the sky, earth, forests and, forces of nature. The Māori believe that all things of the land are descended from the Gods and that they have a soul. Their spirituality is woven into every aspect of their life because they believe that most things contain mana, a spiritual essence, and that if it is disrespected, it can be drained away. In former times, a Godstick was used for rites and the priest would use the Godstick to make contact with the ancestors and spirits whom they believe protect them.

## **The Mayans**

The Mayans were superior astronomers. They used their understanding of the stars to create their calendar and timekeeping. The stars inspired the layout of the Mayan temples and observatories and were the source of the sacred numerology from the Divine. They were very advanced people who predicted and charted lunar and solar eclipses and the movements of Venus and Mars. They became the bridge keepers between the visible and the invisible. They were also able to formulate the future, which was recorded in codices, which are ancient manuscript texts in book form.

## **The Navajo – Connection between Earth to Heaven**

Whereas the Hopi bring the Earth to the stars and heaven, the Navajo source sacred wisdom to bring the heavens to the Earth. They access star panels called ‘planetaria’, which have proven to be prophetic and inspirational. They have been witnessed and seen as paintings in lost caves and ceilings. They believe in ceremonies that call in ‘star trails’, which are motions of stars due to Earth’s rotation. Their belief is that these star trails banish all universal evil around anything created by the Divine, the Universe, or sacred spirits. They revere and consider the earth and universe as sacred and this worldview must be respected in order to begin to understand it.

## **The Thirteen Grandmothers – Connection Between, Within, and Above**

In all cultures, there are beings, visible and invisible that are archetypes of Grandmothers. To the indigenous people, the grandmother represents past energies of healing, teaching, and knowledge. Thirteen denotes our seven chakras within and six outer stars, representing the six sacred directions, north, south, east, west, above, and below. The six sacred directions are doorways into our aura and provide a connection to divine wisdom from the celestial realm of the Universe. They believe that Grandmother Moon and Grandfather Sun are offering us the greatest gift, which is our birthing process into the sacred heart space.
